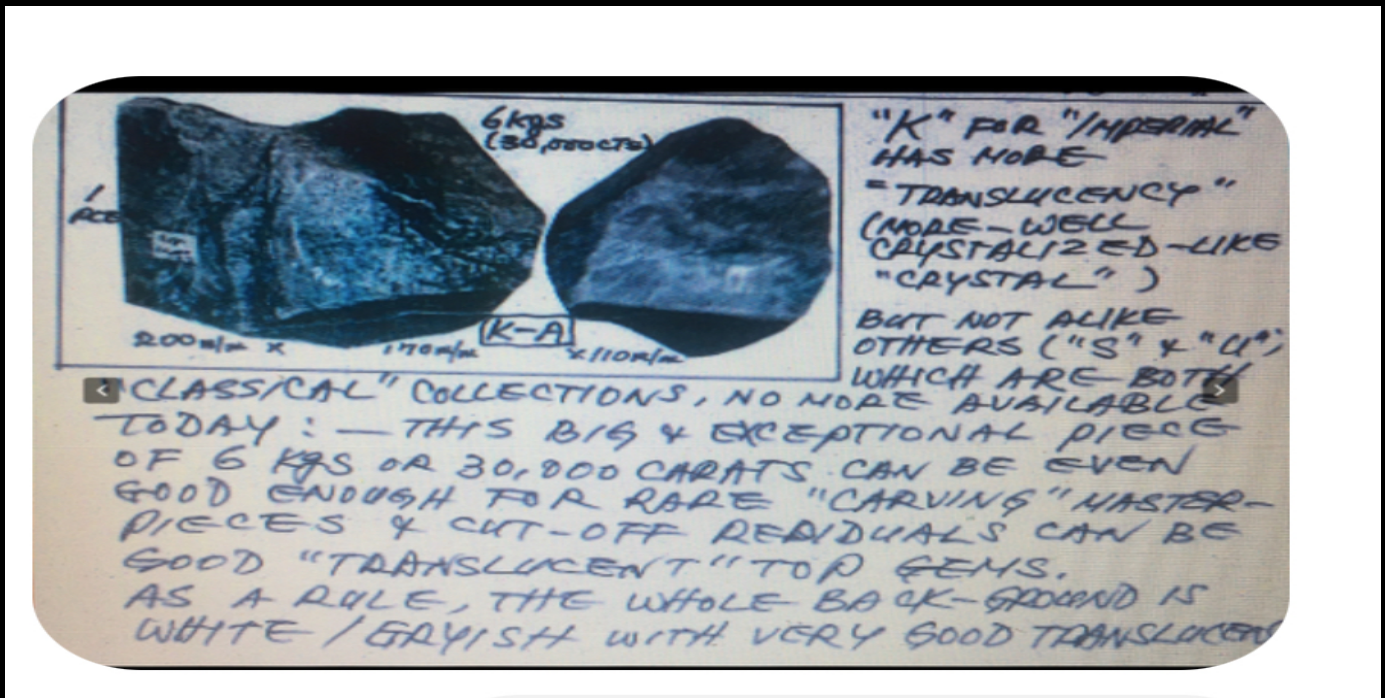

## Market & Investment Value

- **Rough Valuation (as is): \$6 million – \$10 million** (based on size, translucency, zoning, and certification).
